Resolution No. 2018-009

A Resolution of the Menahga City Council Requesting City of Menahga Police Officer Martin Penner be Accepted as a Member of the Public Employees Police and Fire Plan

WHEREAS, the policy of the State of Minnesota as declared in Minnesota Statute 353.36 Policy, is to give special consideration to employees who perform hazardous work and devote their time and skills to protecting the property and personal safety of others; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statute 353.64 Subdivision 2, permits governmental subdivisions to request coverage in the Public Employees Police and Fire Plan for eligible employees of police or sheriff departments whose position duties meet the requirements stated below.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Menahga City Council hereby that the position of part-time police officer, currently held by Martin Penner meets all of the following Police and Fire Plan membership requirements.

1. The position requires a license by the Minnesota Peace Officer Standards and Training Board as stated in Minnesota Statute 626.84 through 626.863 and Martin Penner holds the required license;
2. Over 50 percent of the position's primary duty is to enforce the general criminal laws of the state;
3. The position charges Officer Penner with crime prevention and detention;
4. The position gives Officer Penner the full power of arrest; and
5. The position is assigned to a designated police or sheriff's department.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Menahga hereby requests that Martin Penner be accepted as a member of the Public Employees Police and Fire Plan effective the date Martin Penner's initial Police and Fire Plan salary deduction by the City of Menahga.
